QUESTION/THOUGHTS	REESPONSE/ANSWER
Funding and financing	The ministry of health will be funding this project. The funds are flowed from the Ministry however it is not a "government" building.
The BIA, Chamber of Commerce and the Heritage Committee work really hard on the downtown core. Will you be meeting with these groups?	The project architects have been meeting with these community groups on other projects and will ensure they are kept informed. They are currently working with these community groups on the museum project.
Will there be solar considerations?	Solar will be considered but it is quite costly and the mechanical engineers will have to research this aspect. We are looking at all kinds of sustainable initiatives.
Downtown business owners are in attendance of this meeting this evening and will come back to the meeting in November. Business owners should have some input because this building will be around a long time. Could we be given an opportunity to meet and give our input as business owners and stakeholders in the downtown core?	It was agreed that a meeting with the BIA and property stakeholders would take place before the November community meeting. This meeting will involve discussions about the exterior design of the building.
What level of approval is required to use environment friendly products?	<p>There is no rezoning required. This facility is not an emergency care or surgery facility and will not require a generator etc.</p> <p>We are currently part of an emergency plan (i.e. H1N1). A new plan will be made for this location however it has not been created at this time as we have been working out of a temporary location.</p> <p>The new facility will have isolation rooms to deal with infectious disease issues.</p>
In many instances, community organizations have teaching areas.	There is space allocated for students.
Geothermal – what is it?	Geothermal has no impact on design, but is more about drilling into the ground to use the earth's thermal properties to help heat/cool the building. In some cases this makes sense, but this area has a great deal of bedrock and drilling may not be feasible due to cost.

Community hubs make sense to help the Napanee CHC to promote the determinants of health.</p>
<p>Some thoughts to consider in the site plan i.e. bike racks, other types of vehicular allowances for parking. Such as taxi or buses.</p> <p>You may also consider speaking with Hydro One re: power interruptions.</p>	<p>Agreed.</p> <p>A generator would be costly however, if the need is recognized the ministry would have to be consulted.</p>
<p>Sound barriers. White noise needs to be considered.</p>	<p>Silencers, double drywall and major ducts will run in corridor ceilings with branch ducts feeding each room. It will be the same design as in hospitals. Engineers will be consulted in the design process.</p> <p>The ministry will also review the design to determine we meet "Ministry" requirements.</p>
